Discussion Questions:

- 1. What moment or character stood out to you the most or moved you the most during this episode? Why?
- 2. What did you feel when all of the men, except Matthew started reciting Ezekiel?
- 3. When Philip went to being Nathanael to Jesus, Nathanael said, "I've never seen you talk like this." What will it take for you to talk so compellingly about Jesus to someone?
- 4. Can you relate to feeling like God was hiding His face from you? What can you conclude by Jesus' being aware of Nathanael's lowest moment?
- 5. How did you feel when Matthew drew the circle and had the conversation with Philip?
- 6. Peter advocated for more structure. What was he really wanting?
- 7. Jesus said, "Each brings something unique to the whole. I want every voice heard. We can all learn something from each other. "Why do need each other?
- 8. Why do the disciples disagree about writing down Jesus' words? How do we still see that playing out today?
- 9. What was a time that you felt like Nathanael under the fig tree?
- 10. Think about the scene when Thaddeus talks about prayer with Matthew. He says, "It started out as a chore. Now, I love it. How do you feel about your prayer life?
