# Guide for Discussion, Reflection and Listening (cont.)

## Discussion Questions:

1. What is a moment or character that moved you or touched you in this episode?
2. The Mary Magdalene storyline is not part of scripture, but what **IS** true is how Jesus searches for the lost and restores those who have fallen away from him? How have **you** experienced forgiveness from the Lord?
3. Does Jesus' response to the return of Mary Magdalene remind you of any of His parables?
4. Mother Mary and Ramah have a conversation about the difference between our God and the God of the Egyptians "who they believe they can will to do things for them." Have you ever wished that you could will God to do something for you? Change something for you? Have you ever wondered why God let's things happen and doesn't change it because that's what you what to happen?
5. Mary said to Peter, "He already fixed me once. And I broke again. I can't face him." What would you tell someone who feels that they can't face Jesus because of they fear admitting they have failed? What do you tell yourself to move to point of asking for forgiveness?
6. A lot happens in the is episode and Jesus' response to Thomas is to pray. How do we respond when things seem to be falling apart around us?
7. Why were the disciples shocked by Jesus' decision to "pray" about things? Why is it hard for us to see prayer as a first step toward dealing with life's issues?
8. The episode began with a flashback to David. It ends with the disciples eating grain. What is God teaching us about the Written Law and the Law of God?
9. When Jesus forgave Mary they were in His tent. Was this to recall the tent of Tabernacle in the Old Testament?
